Explanation of survey: There have been multiple reports and surveys conducted that indicate how much keeping a resident in treatment SAVES the State in criminal justice, emergency medical care and other costs. We are taking the opposite approach of surveying how much the residents CONTRIBUTE to the State while in treatment. This contribution is an offset to the cost of treatment to some degree. (The COST of treatment is \$75.00 per day or \$13,500 per six month stay). But in reality, every earned dollar by the residents is returned to the Commonwealth in purchases, as is the vast majority of the \$75.00 per day that the programs receive for each day of treatment for a resident. All of these resident and program dollars are used to purchase goods and services from businesses in the Commonwealth and generate sales and income tax revenues.
